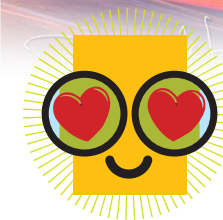

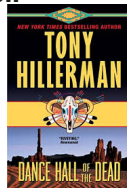

In-Library Databases

The world of information is available at your fingertips, but how do you sort through all of it? The library has a wealth of databases to help you. Here's highlighting a few databases which can only be accessed from within the library.

AncestryLibrary.com (Ancestry.com)

Start searching billions of records, including census, vitals, military, and immigration and discover your family's story.

AccessScience

AccessScience is an enormous high-quality reference database that covers all major scientific disciplines. It offers links to primary research material, videos and exclusive animations, plus specially designed curriculum maps for teachers. It includes 8,500 articles and Research Reviews covering all major scientific disciplines and more than 118,000 downloadable images and animations illustrating key topics.

Mitchell Manuals Pro

Access the all the vehicle service manuals information the pros use! Find detailed pages about maintenance, codes, wiring diagrams, and more. Get real-world information with user created tips, workarounds, and diagnostic trouble-shooting successes. Find manuals and information on vehicles built prior to 1983.

NewspaperARCHIVE

Explore your family tree and discover your history at the world's largest online newspaper archive. This database is a quick and easy-to-use resource for historical and genealogical information. It spans more than 400 years of family history, small-town events, world news, and more. Type a name in the search fields and see who was in the news!
