Instructions and Goals

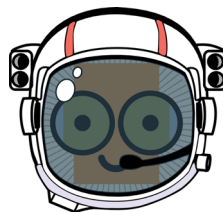

Goal 3 - Read 25 more books/hours (for a total of 50).

Read 25 more books and/or 25 hours, or any combination of the two. Once you have completed your GREEN chart, return it to the library and you will be entered into a drawing for a chance to win a GIFT BASKET (4 gift baskets will be awarded- two created for pre-readers, two for readers).

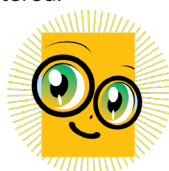

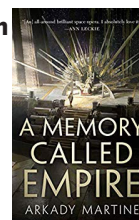
