

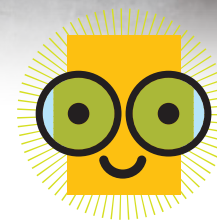

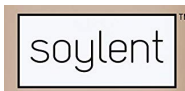

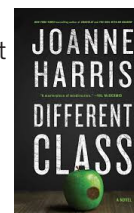


The group will meet prior to the meeting around 5:00 pm at Carl's Bar for food and drinks.

Mystery Mavens meet the fourth Tuesday of every month. This month's book is DIFFERENT CLASS by Joanne Harris.

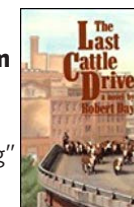

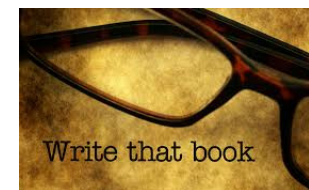
